Basis for Opinion

The Statement also includes the Group's share of net profit/ (loss) after tax of ₹20.33 crores and ₹74.51 crores and total comprehensive income/ (loss) of ₹20.59 crores and ₹74.86 crores for the quarter ended March 31, 2022 and for the year ended March 31, 2022, respectively, as considered in the Statement, in respect of one associate whose
