- These financial results have been prepared in accordance with the recognition & measurement principles under Ind-AS as prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with the relevant rules issued thereunder and the other accounting principles generally accepted in India
- The above financial results were reviewed by the Audit Committee and then approved by the Board of Directors of the Company at their meeting held on 11 June 2021 through video conferencing

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- The Company is exclusively engaged in the business of designing and manufacturing of Propeller Shafts and other accessories required for automotive industrial, agricultural and other applications which in the context of Indian Accounting Standard (Ind.AS-108) on "Operating Segments", is considered as a single operating segment.
- The Company is operating its manufacturing facility as per the guidelines framed by the Ministry of Home Affairs, the State of Maharashtra as well as Local Administration on COVID-19. In preparation of these results, the company has considered the possible effects that may result due to COVID-19 such as recoverability of assets including inventories & trade receivables. In developing the assumptions relating to future uncertainties in the economic conditions due to COVID-19, it has used relevant internal & external sources of information including economic forecasts and expects that the earrying amount of these assets are recoverable. However, the actual impact of COVID-19 may differ from that as estimated as at the date of approval of these financial results. It will continue to closely monitor the developments.
- 5 The figures of the last quarters are the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published year to date figures upto the third quarter of the respective financial years which have been subjected to limited review by the auditors
- The figures of the previous year have been regrouped / rearranged wherever considered necessary

#### Report on the Audit of the Financial Results

#### Opinion

We have audited the accompanying statement of quarterly and year to date financial results of **Hindustan HardyLimited** ("the Company"), for the quarter ended March 31, 2021 and for the year ended March 31, 2021 ("the Statement") attached herewith, being submitted by the company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("the Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the Statement:

- i. is presented in accordance with the requirements of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and
- ii. gives a true and fair view in conformity with the applicable accounting standards prescribed and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company, net profit, other comprehensive incomeand other financial information of the company for the quarter ending March 31, 2021, net profit, other comprehensive income and other financial information of the companyfor the year ending March 31, 2021.

#### **Basis for Opinion**
