Report on the Audit of Standalone Financial Results

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying statement of standalone annual financial results of NAGREEKA EXPORTS LIMITED (hereinafter referred to as the "Company"), for the year ended March 31, 2023 (the "Statement"), being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended (the "Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid standalone annual financial results:

- are presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations in this regard and;
- b) gives a true and fair view in conformity with recognition and measurement principles laid down in the applicable Indian Accounting Standard ("IND AS") prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act 2013 (the "Act") read with relevant rules issued there under and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the standalone net profit and standalone total comprehensive profit and other financial information of the Company for the year ended March 31, 2023, standalone statement of assets and liabilities as at March 31, 2023 and the standalone statement of cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit of the Statement in accordance with the Standards on Auditing ("SA"s) specified under Section 143(10) of the Act. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Standalone Financial Results section of our report. The confirmations of trade receivables, trade payables and advances to suppliers and advances from customers' and other advances are subject to confirmation and reconciliation. Hence any material impact as on the reporting date cannot be ascertained.

Management's Responsibilities for the Standalone Financial Results

These standalone annual results have been prepared on the basis of the standalone financial statements. This Statement, is the responsibility of the Company's Management and approved by the Board of Directors, has been prepared on the basis of standalone financial statements for the year ended March 31, 2023. The Company's Board of Directors are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the Standalone Financial Results that give a true and fair view of the net profit and other comprehensive income and other financial information in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in Ind AS 34, prescribed under Section 133 of the Act, read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and the design, ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the Standalone Financial Results that give a true and fair view and is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the Standalone Financial Results, the Board of Directors are responsible for assessing the Company's ability, to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board of Directors are also responsible for overseeing the financial reporting process of the Company.
