#### Independent Auditors' Report on the Standalone Financial Results

#### To the Board of Directors of Oriental Hotels Limited

#### Opinion

- We have audited the accompanying Standalone Financial Results of Oriental Hotels Limited ("the Company"), for the quarter and year ended 31 March 2021 ('the Statement'), being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("Listing Regulations").
- 2. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the statement:
  - a) is presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations, in this regard;
  - b) gives a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the applicable Indian accounting standards and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the net loss and other comprehensive income and other financial information of the company for the guarter and year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March 2021.

#### **Basis for Opinion**

3. We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Standalone Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the standalone financial statements under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

#### **Emphasis of Matter**

4. Note 5 to the Standalone financial results, regarding the management's assessment of the impact of Covid-19 including assessment of liquidity and going concern assumptions, recoverable values of its financial and non-financial assets appearing in the financial statements of the company as at 31 March 2021 and impact on revenues and costs, The Company has considered internal and external sources of information and has performed sensitivity analysis on the assumptions used and based on current estimates, and its judgments on the implications, expects to recover the carrying amount of these assets. This being an unprecedented event which is difficult to estimate, the actual implications could vary. Our opinion is not modified in respect of the above matter.

5 The business has been severely impacted during the year on account of COVID-19. The Company witnessed softer revenues due to the lockdown imposed during the first six months of the year and few of the Company's hotels had to be shut down. With the unlocking of restrictions, all the Company's hotels have been opened and business is expected to gradually improve across all hotels. During the second half of the year, the Company witnessed some signs of recovery of demand, especially in leisure destinations. Whilst there has been a second wave of the COVID-19 pandemic in the last few months in some States, there has also been increased vaccination drive by the Government and the Company continues to closely monitor the situation.

The Company has also assessed the possible impact of COVID-19 in preparation of the standalone financial results, including but not limited to its assessment of liquidity and going concern assumption, recoverable values of its financial and non-financial assets and impact on SAW revenues and costs. The Company has considered internal and external sources of information and has performed sensitivity analysis on the assumptions used and based on current estimates.

expects to recover the carrying amount of these assets. The impact of Covid-19 may be different from that estimated as at the date of approval of these standalone financial results and the Company will continue to closely monitor any material changes to future economic conditions.

The Company has adequate funds at its disposal and the Management is confident of securing additional financing, as required for the next 12 months to enable the Company to meet its debts and obligations as they fall due. Accordingly, the financial results of the Company have been prepared on a going concern basis.

- 6 Disclosure of segment wise information is not applicable as Hoteliering is the Company's only business segment.
- The figures for the three months ended March 31, 2021 and three months ended March 31, 2020 are arrived at as the difference between audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published unaudited figures up to nine months of the relevant financial year.
- The Indian Parliament has approved the Code on Social security 2020 which would impact the contributions by the Company towards Provident Fund and Gratuity. The draft rules for the same were released in November 2020 and the Govt has invited suggestions from the stakeholders, and these are under the active consideration of the Ministry of Labour and Employment. The Government has now deferred the implementation of the Codes, beyond Apr 1, 2021. The Company will assess the impact and its evaluation once the rules are notified and will make necessary provision for the impact in the period in which the Code becomes effective and related rules are published.

- 9. We communicate with those charged with governance of the Holding Company regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.
- 10. We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.
- 11. We also performed procedures in accordance with the circular No CJR/CFD/CMDI/44/2019 issued by the SEBI under Regulation 33(8) of the Listing Regulations, as amended, to the extent applicable.

#### Other Matters

- 12. Attention is drawn to the fact that the figures for the quarter ended 31st March 2021 are the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of full financial year and the published unaudited year to date figures up to the end of the third quarter of the current financial year which were subject to limited review by us. Our report is not modified in respect of this matter.
- 13. We did not audit the financial information of subsidiary company (refer para 2(a)(I)) included in the Statement, whose audited financial information, reflect total assets of Rs. 14,046.30 lakhs, total revenues of Rs. 1.21 lakhs and Rs. 17.95 lakhs, total loss after tax of Rs. 1.41 lakhs and total profit after tax of Rs. 7.53 lakhs for the quarter and year ended 31 March 2021, respectively, and net cash inflow of Rs. 156.44 lakhs for the year ended 31st March 2021, as considered in the audited Consolidated Financial Results. This audited financial information has been audited by another auditor whose report has been furnished to us and our opinion on the Statement, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of this subsidiary is based solely on the report of the other auditor and the procedures performed by us as stated in paragraph 11 above. Our report on the Statement is not modified in respect of this matter with respect to reliance on the work done and the report of another auditor.
- 14. The accompanying statement also includes the Group's share of net loss after tax of Rs. 165.91 Lakhs and Rs. 1,512.17 lakhs of the jointly controlled entity (Refer para 2(a)(II)) respectively for the quarter and year ended 31st March 2021, as considered in the audited Consolidated Financial Results. This audited financial information has been audited by another auditor whose report has been furnished to us and our opinion on the Statement, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of this jointly controlled entity is based solely on the report of the other auditor and the procedures performed by us as stated in paragraph 11 above. Our report on the Statement is not modified in respect of this matter with respect to reliance on the work done and the report of another auditor.
- 15. The accompanying statement also includes the Group's share of net profit after tax of Rs. 40.53 lakhs and net loss after tax of Rs. 257.67 lakhs of two associates (Refer para 2(a)(III)) respectively for the quarter and year ended 31st March 2021, as considered in the audited Consolidated Financial Results. This audited financial information has been audited by another auditor whose report has been furnished to us and our opinion on the Statement, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these associates is based solely

on the report of the other auditor and the procedures performed by us as stated in paragraph 11 above. Our report on the Statement is not modified in respect of this matter with respect to reliance on the work done and the report of another auditor.

16. The Holding Company's subsidiary, one of its associates and the jointly controlled entity are located outside India whose financial statements and other financial information have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in their respective countries and which have been audited by other auditors under generally accepted auditing standards applicable in their respective countries. The Holding Company's management has converted the financial statements of the subsidiary, associate and jointly controlled entity located outside India from accounting principles generally accepted in their respective countries to accounting principles generally accepted in India, and this has been audited by another auditor. Our opinion in so far as it relates to the balances and affairs of such subsidiary, associates and jointly controlled entity located outside India is based on the report of this other auditor and the conversion adjustments prepared by the management of the holding company.

Our opinion on the consolidated financial results is not modified in respect of the above matters with respect to our reliance on the work done and the reports of the other auditor and the conversion adjustments certified by the management.

- 2. These consolidated financial results have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles of Indian Accounting Standards ("Ind AS") prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with the relevant rules (as amended) issued thereunder and the other accounting principles generally accepted in India.
- 3. The Group holding has credited ₹ Nil lakhs and ₹ 26 lakhs for the quarter and year ended 31st March 2021 respectively, being rent concessions received, to Other Income. This is in accordance with paragraph 46A and 46B of IND AS 116, notified by MCA vide its notification dated 24 July 2020.

5. The Consolidated Financial Results for the holding company for the year ended March 31, 2021 & March 31, 2020 have been prepared in accordance with the applicable Accounting Standards, and based on the audited accounts of its subsidiary, jointly controlled entity and associate Companies.

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- 6. Disclosure of segment wise information is not applicable as Hoteliering is the Company's only business segment.
- 7. The figures for the three months ended March 31, 2021 and three months ended March 31, 2020 are arrived at as the difference between audited figures in respect of the full financial years and the published figures unaudited up to nine months of the relevant financial year
- 8. The business has been severely impacted during the year on account of COVID-19. The Group witnessed softer revenues due to the lockdown imposed during the first six months of the year and few of the Group hotels had to be shut down. With the unlocking of restrictions, all the Group hotels have been opened and business is expected to gradually improve across all hotels. During the second half of the year, the Group witnessed some signs of recovery of demand, especially in leisure destinations. Whilst there has been a second wave of the COVID-19 pandemic in the last few months in some locations, there has also been increased vaccination drive by the Government and the Group continues to closely monitor the situation.

The Group has also assessed the possible impact of COVID-19 in preparation of the Consolidated financial results, including but not limited to its assessment of liquidity and going concern assumption, recoverable values of its financial and non-financial assets and impact on revenues and costs. The Group has considered internal and external sources of information and has performed sensitivity analysis on the assumptions used and based on current estimates, expects to recover the carrying amount of these assets. The impact of Covid-19 may be different from that estimated as at the date of approval of these Consolidated financial results and the Group will continue to closely monitor any material changes to future economic conditions.

The Group has adequate funds at its disposal and the Management is confident of securing additional financing, as required for the next 12 months to enable the Group to meet its debts and obligations as they fall due. Accordingly, the financial results of the Group have been prepared on a going concern basis.



- The Indian Parliament has approved the Code on Social security 2020 which would impact the contributions by the Company towards Provident Fund and Gratuity. The draft rules for the same were released in November 2020 and the Govt has invited suggestions from the stakeholders, and these are under the active consideration of the Ministry of Labour and Employment. The Government has now deferred the implementation of the Codes, beyond Apr 1, 2021. The Group will assess the impact and its evaluation once the rules are notified and will make necessary provision for the impact in the period in which the Code becomes effective and related rules are published.
- 10 The Board of Directors of the Parent Company have not recommended any dividend for the year ended 31st March 2021.
