To the Board of Directors of Weizmann Limited
Report on the audit of the Standalone financial results

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying standalone financial results of Weizmann Limited (hereinafter referred to as the "Company") for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2021, attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ('Listing Regulations').

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid standalone financial results:

- i. are presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and
- ii. give a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the applicable Indian Accounting Standards, and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the net profit and other comprehensive income and other financial information for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2021.

The impact of COVID-19 on the Company's financial statements may differ from that estimated as at the date of approval of these financial statements

 - Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.
- 2. The Consolidated financial Statement includes the Holding Company's share of net loss of Rs. 104.27 lakhs and other comprehensive loss of Rs. 17.09 for the quarter ended March 31, 2021 and its share of net profit of Rs 26.39 lakhs and other comprehensive loss Rs 45.38 lakhs for the year ended March 31, 2021 in respect of the associate company, 'Windia Infrastructure Finance Limited' (a Non-Banking Finance Company). These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting standards prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read together with paragraph 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 (hereinafter referred to as the 'previous GAAP') and have been reviewed by other auditor whose report have been furnished to us. The management of the Holding Company has restated these Financial Statements in accordance with Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 (Ind AS) and are reviewed by us so far as it related to conversion adjustments from Previous GAAP to Ind AS.
