**Report on the Audit of Standalone Annual Financial Results** 

## Opinion

We have audited the accompanying standalone annual financial results of Diamines and Chemicals Limited (hereinafter referred to as the "Company") for the year ended March 31, 2021, attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid standalone annual financial results:

- (i) are presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and
- (ii) give a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the applicable accounting standards, and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of net profit and other comprehensive income and other financial information of the Company for the year ended March 31, 2021.

#### **Basis for Opinion**

- 3 The nature of the company's business is such that by and large, it continues to remain unaffected from the effects of Covid-19 pandemic. Therefore, there is no material impact on the operations and financials of the company for the quarter and year ended 31st March, 2021. The Company will continue to closely monitor any material changes to future economic conditions.
- 4 Figures for the quarters ended 31st March, 2021 and 31st March, 2020 as reported in these financial results are balancing figures between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year and published year to date reviewed figures up to third quarter of the relevant financial year.
- 5 Pursuant to the introduction of Section 115BAA of the Income Tax Act, 1961 vide Taxation Laws (Amendment) Act, 2019 the company has an option to pay corporate income tax at the rate of 22% plus applicable surcharge and cess (lower rate) subject to certain conditions. During the quarter ended 31st December, 2020, the Company had decided to avail the lower tax rate from Financial Year 2019-20. Accordingly, the Company has recognized provision for income taxes on the basis of the rate prescribed in the said section.
- 6 The Company has recognised impairment provision of ₹118.70 Lakhs on power generation segment during the quarter ended 31st March, 2021.
- 8 The Company has identified two reportable primary segments viz, Speciality Chemicals and Power Generation.
- 9 Figures of corresponding previous year/period(s) have been regrouped /rearranged wherever necessary, to make them comparable.

The respective Board of Directors of the Companies included in the Group is also responsible for overseeing the financial reporting process of the Group.

Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditors' report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Group to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the Consolidated annual financial results, including the disclosures, and whether the financial results represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.
- Obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence regarding the financial results/financial
  information of the entities within the Group to express an opinion on the consolidated
  Financial Results. We are responsible for the direction, supervision and performance of
  the audit of financial information of an entities included in the consolidated financial
  results of which we are the independent auditors. We remain solely responsible for our
  audit opinion.

We communicate with those charged with governance of the Holding Company regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

We also performed procedures in accordance with the circular issued by the SEBI under Regulation 33(8) of the Listing Regulations, as amended, to the extent applicable.

- 1 The above audited consolidated financial results have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013.
- 2 The above audited consolidated financial results have been reviewed and recommended by the Audit Committee of the holding company and taken on record in its meeting held on 17th May, 2021 and subsequently approved by the Board of Directors of the Holding Company in its meeting held on 18th May, 2021. These consolidated financial results have been audited by Statutory Auditors as required under Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended.
- The Holding Company has incorporated a wholly owned subsidiary namely, DACL Fine Chem Limited on 30th July 2020. The annual financial results of the said subsidiary have been audited by Statutory Auditors.
- Since the above-referred wholly owned subsidiary was incorporated during the quarter ended 30th September, 2020, the presentation of consolidated financial results became applicable to the holding company from the quarter ended 30th September, 2020 and therefore, the comparative consolidated financial results have not been presented for the periods prior to quarter ended 30th September, 2020.
- 5 Figures for the quarters ended 31st March, 2021 as reported in these financial results are balancing figures between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year and published year to date reviewed figures up to third quarter of the financial year.
- 6 Pursuant to the introduction of Section 115BAA of the Income Tax Act, 1961 vide Taxation Laws (Amendment) Act, 2019 the holding company has an option to pay corporate income tax at the rate of 22% plus applicable surcharge and cess (lower rate) subject to certain conditions. During the quarter ended 31st December, 2020, the Holding Company had decided to avail the lower tax rate from Financial Year 2019-20. Accordingly, the Group has recognized provision for income taxes on the basis of the rate prescribed in the said section.
- The holding company has recognised impairment provision of ₹118.70 Lakhs on power generation segment during the quarter ended 31st March, 2021.
- The Board of Directors of the Holding Company has recommended a final dividend @ 50 % (₹ 5 /- per equity share of face value ₹ 10 each) for the financial year ended 31st March, 2021.
- The Group has identified two reportable primary segments viz, Speciality Chemicals and Power Generation.
- 10 The nature of Group's business is such that by and large, it continues to remain unaffected from the effects of Covid-19 pandemic. Therefore, there is no material impact on the operations and financials of the Group for the quarter and year ended 31st March, 2021. The Group will continue to closely monitor any material changes to future economic conditions.
- 11 Figures of corresponding previous period(s) have been regrouped /rearranged wherever necessary, to make them comparable.
