#### Note:

- 1. The above results have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors of the Company at the Board meeting held on 23rd June, 2021. The statuory auditors have issued audit report with unmodified opinion on these results.
- 2. The above audited standalone result has been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards ('Ind AS') notified under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read together with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules 2015.
- 3. The Company has reported segment information as per Indian Accounting Standards 108 "Operating Segments" (Ind AS 108).
- 4. The figures of last quarter in each of the financial years are the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published year to date unaudited figures upto the end of the third quarter of the respective financial year.
- 5. The Company elected to exercise the option permitted under section 115BAA of the Income Tax Act, 1961 as introduced by the Taxation Laws (Amendment) Ordinance, 2019. Accordingly, the Company has recognized Provision for Income Tax for the year ended 31st March, 2021 and re-measured its Deferred Tax Assets basis the rate prescribed in the said section. The full impact of this change has been recognized in the statement of Profit & Loss for March, 2021.
- 6. In view of pandemic relating to COVID-19, the company has considered internal and external information and has performed sensitivity analysis based on current estimates in assessing the recoverability of rent receivables, unbilled receivables and other financial assets. However, the actual impact of COVID-19 on the company's financial statements may differ from the estimates and the company will continue to closely monitor any material changes to future economic conditions.
- 7. Previous period / year figures have been regrouped / rearranged wherever necessary.

- ii. are presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and
- iii. give a true and fair view in conformity with the applicable accounting standards, and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of consolidated net profit and other comprehensive income and other financial information of the Group for the year ended March 31, 2021.
