In terms of Regulation 30 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, we wish to inform you that the Board of Directors of the Company in their meeting held on today i.eTuesday, May30, 2023, *inter-alia*:

- 1. considered, approved and took on record the Audited Financial Results of the Company for the fourth quarter and financial year ended on March 31, 2023 along with the Auditor's Report by the Statutory Auditors of the Company. Copy of the same is attached herewith for your reference.
 - Further, pursuant to Regulation 33(3)(d) of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, a declaration that the Statutory Auditors of the Company have issued an Audit Report with an unmodified opinion on the Audited Financial Results of the Company for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2023, is also attached herewith.
- 2. considered and approved the allotment of conversion of 16,30,000 warrants into 16,30,000 equity shares of face value of Rs. 10/- each, out of the 36,60,000 warrants allotted on February 3, 2023 on preferential basis, upon receipt of an amount aggregating to Rs. 9,92.67,000/- (Rupees Nine Crore Ninety-Two Lakhs Sixty-Seven Thousands only) at the rate of Rs. 60.90 (Rupees Sixty and Ninety Paisa Only) per warrant (being 75% of the issue price per warrant) from the allottees pursuant to the exercise of their rights of conversion into equity shares in accordance with the provisions of SEBI (ICDR) Regulations, 2018 and list of allottees is enclosed as **Annexure-I.**



Opinion
