Report on the audit of the Financial Results

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying statement of quarterly and year to date financial results of Orient Electric Limited (the "Company") for the quarter ended March 31, 2022 and for the year ended March 31, 2022 ("Statement"), attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended (the "Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the Statement:

- i. is presented in accordance with the requirements of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and
- ii. gives a true and fair view in conformity with the applicable accounting standards and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the net profit and other comprehensive income and other financial information of the Company for the quarter ended March 31, 2022 and for the year ended March 31, 2022.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013, as amended ("the Act"). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the "Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Results" section of our report. In preparing the Statement, the Board of Directors are responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

1 The above financial results of the Company were reviewed by the Audit Committee and taken on record by the Board of Directors of the Company in the meeting held on May 10, 2022.

2 These financial results have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (IND-AS) as prescribed under section 133 of Companies Act 2013 read with Rule 3 of the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules 2015 (as amended).

3 As per IND AS 108 - Operating segments, the Company has two reportable segments namely Electrical Consumer Durables and Lighting & Switchgear. The financial information for these segments are accompanying the financial results as per IND AS 108 -Operating Segments.

- 4 The Board of Directors at their meeting held on May 10, 2022 recommended a final dividend of Rs. 1.25 (@ 125%) per equity share of Re.1 each of the Company, making a total dividend of Rs. 2.00 (@ 200%) per equity share of Re.1 each for the financial year 2021-22, including interim dividend of Re. 0.75 (@ 75%) per equity share declared earlier during the financial year 2021-22. Final Dividend is subject to the approval of the shareholders.
- 5 The global pandemic outbreak had impacted the Company's business in early part of the financial year. However, the Company has been able to recover the business in course of the year. The Company has made an impact assessment of the pandemic and basis the current year results and best estimates of revenue, expenses and current assets, as on the date of reporting, the Company does not anticipate any material impact on the recoverability of the carrying value of its assets. The management has also estimated future cash flows for the Company and believes that there will be no impact on its ability to continue as going concern and meeting its liabilities as and when they fall due. However, considering the unpredictability and inherent uncertainty on the potential future impact of the pandemic, the Company's financial results may differ from that estimated as on the date of approval of these financial results.
- 6 The figures for the quarter ended March 31, 2022 are the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of full financial year upto March 31, 2022 and unaudited published year to date figures upto December 31, 2021, being the date of the end of the third quarter of the financial year which were subjected to limited review.
- 7 Previous quarter/ period ended/ year ended figures have been regrouped/restated wherever necessary.
