Opinion

- 1. We have audited the accompanying Statement of quarterly and year to date standalone financial results of **HB STOCKHOLDINGS LIMITED** ("the Company") for the quarter and the year ended 31st March, 2023 ("the Statement"), attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 as amended (the "Listing Regulations").
- 2. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the statement:
 - (i) is presented in accordance with the requirements of Listing Obligations in this regard, and;
 - (ii) give a true and fair view in conformity with the applicable Ind AS and other Accounting Principles generally accepted in India, of the standalone net loss after tax and other comprehensive income and other financial information of the Company for the year ended 31st March, 2023.

Basis for Opinion

3. We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards of Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013 as amended ("the Act"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the "Auditors Responsibility for the Audit of the Standalone Financial Results" section of our report. We are independent of the company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the Rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence obtained by us is sufficient and appropriate to provide basis for our opinion.

4. The statement has been prepared on the basis of the standalone annual financial statements. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the statement that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

5.
