Notes:

- 1. The above consolidated and standalone financial results of Allsec Technologies Limited ("the Company") for the quarter and year ended 31 March 2020 are prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards ("Ind AS") as prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") read with relevant rules issued thereunder and in terms of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements Regulations, 2015,
- 2. The above results have been reviewed and recommended by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors in their meeting held on 18 May 2020. The results for the year ended 31 March 2020 has been reviewed by our statutory auditors, The statutory auditors have expressed an unmodified opinion thereon. The Ind AS consolidated and standalone financial statements of the Company for the year ended 31 March 2019, were audited by the Walker Chandiok & Co LLP, Chartered Accountants, the predecessor auditor who had expressed an unqualified audit opinion.
- 3. The figures for the current quarter and the quarter ended 31 March 2019 are the balancing figures between the annual audited figures for the year ended 31 March 2020 and 31 March 2019, respectively, and the published year to date figures upto the 9 months period ended 31 December 2019 and 31 December 2018, respectively. The predecessor auditors had not issued a separate limited review report on the results and figures for the quarter ended 31 March 2019.
- 4. The consolidated results for the quarter and year ended 31 March 2020 and for the quarter and year ended 31 March 2019 include the results of the Company's wholly owned subsidiaries Allsectech Inc., USA
 Allsectech Manila Inc. Philippines and Retreat Capital Management Inc., USA.
- 5. The Company and the Group has adopted Ind AS 116, "Leases" using the modified retrospective method effective 1 April 2019, and accordingly, the comparatives have not been restated retrospectively in the Statemen of Profit and Loss for the current period, the nature of expenses in respect of operating leases has changed from lease rent in previous periods to depreciation cost for the right-of-use asset and finance cost for interes accrued on lease liability. The impact on profits and earnings per share is not material.
- During the quarter ended 30 September 2019, the Company acquired on a slump sale basis with effect from 30 September 2019, the assets and liabilities of HR Compliance business of Coachive Solutions Private Limited (CSPL'), a subsidiary of Quess Corp Limited for a purchase consideration of INR 1,680 lakhs. The Company accounted for the business combination in accordance with the requirements of Appendix C of Ind AS 103 "Business Combinations' which lays down the principles in respect of accounting for business combinations of entities or businesses under common control. As required by the Standard, pooling of interests method has been considered for common control business combination and accordingly, the assets and liabilities are reflected in the books of the Company at their respective carrying amounts and an adjustment of INR 2,426 lakhs (debtil) has been made to the capital reserve of the Company.
- 7. Exceptional item for the year ended 31 March 2020 represents impairment loss charged to the statement of profit and loss. The Company had carried out an impairment assessment as at 31 March 2020, based on procedures consistent with Ind AS 36 and recognised an impairment loss to the extent of Rs 1,214 Lakhs for investment made in its Allsectech Inc., USA. Exceptional item for the year ended 31 March 2019 represents impairment loss charged to the statement of profit and loss. The Company had carried out an impairment assessment as at 31 March 2019, based on procedures consistent with Ind AS 36 and recognised an impairment loss to the extent of Rs 1,307 Lakhs for investment made in its subsidiary, Retreat Capital Management Inc., USA in the standalone results and Rs 1,247 Lakhs of Goodwill in the consolidated results.
- 8. In assessing the recoverability of receivables including unbilled receivables, contract assets and contract costs, intangible assets, and certain investments, the Company has considered internal and external information up to the date of approval of these audited financials including credit reports and economic forecasts. The Company has performed sensitivity analysis on the assumptions used and based on current indicators of future economic conditions, the Company expects to recover the carrying arount of these assets, The managed of the global health pandemic may be different from that estimated as at the date of approval of these audited financials and the Company will continue to closely monitor any material charges to future economic conditions.





Based on the "management approach" as defined in Ind AS 108 - Operating Segments, the Chief Operating Decision Maker evaluates the group performance and allocates resources based on an analysis of various performance indicators by business segments. Accordingly, information has been presented along these business segments viz. Customer Lifecycle Management (CLM), Human Resource Outsourcing (HRO) and Anti Money Laundering and Regulatory Compliance (AML). The accounting principles used in the preparation of these financial results are consistently applied to record revenue and expenditure in individual segments.

TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF ALLSEC TECHNOLOGIES LIMITED

Opinion and Conclusion

We have (a) audited the Standalone Financial Results for the year ended 31 March 2020 and:

(b) reviewed the Standalone Financial Results for the quarter ended 31 March 2020 (refer 'Other Matters' section below), which were subject to limited review by us,

both ((a) and (b)) included in the accompanying "Statement of Audited Financial Results for the Year Ended 31 March 2020 and Unaudited Financial results for the Quarter Ended 31 March 2020" of **Allsec Technologies Limited** ("the Company"), ("the Statement"), being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirements of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("the Listing Regulations").

(a) Opinion on Annual Financial Results

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the Standalone Financial Results for the year ended 31 March 2020:
