#### Independent Auditor's Report

## TO THE MEMBERS OF MARDIA SAMYOUNG CAPILLARY TUBES Co. LTD.

#### Report on the Standalone Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying standalone financial statements of MARDIA SAMYOUNG CAPILLARY TUBES CO. LTD. ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31 March 2021, the Statement of Profit and Loss, Statement of Changes in Equity and the Statement of Cash Flows for the year then ended, including a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.
