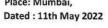

- The financial results of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standard) Rules' 2015 (IND-AS) prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and other recognized accounting practices and policies to the extent applicable.
- 2. The above results have been reviewed by the audit committee and thereafter approved by the Board of Directors in their meeting held on 11th May 2022.
- 3. The Board has recommended a dividend of Re.1/- per share of Rs. 10/- each (10%) for the financial year 2021-22
- 4. During the year ended 31st March 2022, the company has changed the method of depreciation prospectively from WDV to SLM and the assets are depreciated on the basis of balance useful life as on 1st April 2021 as per Companies Act, 2013. Due to this, there is as increase in depreciation by Rs 18.88 lakhs and Rs. 78.15 lakhs for the quarter and year ended 31st March 2022 respectively.
- 5. In accordance with Ind AS-108 "Operating Segments", the company has only one reportable primary business segment i.e. "Chemical Manufacturing". However, the company has secondary geographical segment which is disclosed in the financial statement as per Ind AS- 108.

Independent Auditor's Report

To the Board of Directors of Resonance Specialties Limited

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying annual financial result of Resonance Specialties Limited ('the company') for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2022, attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirements of regulation 33 of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ('Listing Regulation').

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanation given to us, the aforesaid annual financial results:

- a. are presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations in this regards; and
- b. give a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the applicable Indian Accounting Standards, and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the net profit and other comprehensive income and other financial information for the quarter and year then ended March 31, 2022.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standard on Auditing ("SAs") specified under Section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act").
