- 2 The above financial results were reviewed and recommend by the Audit committee later by the Board of Directors of the company in their respective meetings held on 30th May,2023. The Statutory auditors have carried a limited review of financial results.
- 3 The Company operates with Single segment hence Segment information not furnished as per the Ind AS 108 'Operating Segments' notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 read with Accounting Standard (AS) 17 "Segment Reporting" notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014
- 4 Figures for the quarter ended March 31, 2023 and March 31, 2022 are the balancing figures between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year ended March 31, 2023 and March 31, 2022 and unaudited published year to date consolidated figures up to Nine months ended December 31, 2022 respectively.
- 5 Company is closely monitoring the Covid -19 impact on the business operations and utmost importance is given to the safety and well being of the employees and business partners. The Company has considered all the internal and external information upto the date of approval of the financial results in determining the carrying values of the inventories, receivables and other current assets. The impact of the pandemic may be different from the estimates made as on the date of approval of the financial results.
- 6 The effective date from which Code on Social Security 2020, which subsumes nine laws relating to social security, retirement and employee benefits, including the Employees Provident Fund and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 and the Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972 is not yet notified. The financial impact, if any, of the code will be assessed once the effective date of the Code and its rules are notified.
- 7 As the Company order book position is Rs. 30 crores the promoters are confident of coming out of the present position and hopeful of better results in the coming months
- 8 Figures for the previous period have been regrouped/ reclassified where ever necessary to confirm to the current period's presentation

Report on the audit of the Standalone Financial Results

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying standalone quarterly financial results of Sibar Autoparts Limited ("the company") for the quarter ended 31st March, 2023 and the year-to-date results for the year ended 31st March, 2023 attached herewith, being submitted by the company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("Listing Regulations"), including relevant circulars issued by the SEBI from time to time.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us these standalone financial results:

Basis for Opinion
