Independent Auditor's Report

To, The Board of Directors of Swan Energy Limited, Mumbai.

Report on the audit of Standalone Financial Results

I- Opinion

We have audited the accompanying Standalone Financial Results ("SFR") of Swan Energy Limited (the company) for the quarter ended 30th September, 2021 and year-to-date results for the period from 1st April, 2021 to 30th September, 2021, attached herewith, being submitted by the company pursuant to the requirements of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, these SFR:

i. are presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and

ii. give a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the applicable accounting standards and other accounting principles generally accepted in India of the net loss and other comprehensive income and other financial information for the quarter ended 30th September, 2021 as well as year-to-date results for the period from 1st April, 2021 to 30th September, 2021.

II- Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013 (the Act). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the SFR section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the SFR under the provisions of the Act and the Rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

III- Management's Responsibilities for the Standalone Financial Results ("SFR")

These quarterly as well as the year-to-date SFR have been prepared on the basis of the interim financial statements. The Company's Board of Directors are responsible for the preparation of these SFR that give a true and fair view of the net loss and other comprehensive income and other financial information in accordance with the



recognition and measurement principles laid down in Indian Accounting Standards 34, 'Interim Financial Reporting' prescribed under Section 133 of the Act read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the SFR that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the SFR, the Board of Directors are responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board of Directors is also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

IV- Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Standalone Financial Results

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the SFR as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these SFR.

As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- i. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.
- vi. Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the SFR, including the disclosures, and whether the SFR represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance ("TCWG") regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide TCWG with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

V- Other Matters

i. On account of lockdown consequent to outbreak of Covid-19 pandemic, we were unable to participate in the half year physical verification of inventory that was carried out by the Management. Consequently, we have performed alternate procedures as per the guidance provided in SA 501 "Audit Evidence - Specific Consideration for Selected Items" to audit the existence of inventory as at the half year end and have obtained sufficient appropriate audit evidence to issue our unmodified opinion on the SFR. The entire audit finalization process was carried from remote locations i.e., other than the office/factory of the Company where books of account and other records are kept, based on data/ details of financials information provided to us through digital medium, owing to COVID-19.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matters.

- Auditors have carried out an Audit of the aforesaid financial results as required under Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015.
- The Company operates in two segments namely, a) Textiles and b) Construction/others.
- The company's state-of-the-art Textile Processing House has consistently generated profit since inception till F. Y. 2019-20. Thereafter, due to outbreak of Covid 19, followed by imposition of nationwide lockdown, textile business suffered adversely due to which Textile segment reported loss in the F. Y. 2020-21 and half year ended 30th September 2021. With the overall rebound and recovery of the entire economy, we expect that the Textile segment will soon turnaround and will start generating profits in the coming years.
- Provision for Taxation shall be made at the end of the year.
- In view of the outbreak of Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic globally, the Company's business operations were temporarily disrupted. The Company has considered the possible effects, if any, that may result from the pandemic on the carrying amounts of assets after considering internal and external sources of information including the possible future uncertainties in the global economic conditions as at the date of approval of these financial results and has determined that none of these balances require a material adjustment to their carrying value. The Company continues to closely monitor the rapidly changing situation.
- The figures for the previous period have been regrouped and/or rearranged, wherever considered necessary.

II- Basis for Opinion

The Holding Company's Board of Directors are responsible for the preparation and presentation of these CFR that give a true and fair view of the net loss and other comprehensive income and other financial information of the Group in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in Indian Accounting Standards 34, 'Interim Financial Reporting' prescribed under Section 133 of the Act read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations. The respective Board of Directors of the companies included in the Group are responsible for maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Group and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and the design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the CFR that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, which have been used for the purpose of preparation of the CFR by the Directors of the Holding Company, as aforesaid.

We also provide those TCWG with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

We also performed procedures in accordance with the circular issued by the SEBI under Regulation 33(8) of the Listing Regulations, as amended, to the extent applicable.



Thereafter, due to outbreak of Covid 19, followed by imposition of nationwide lockdown, textile business suffered adversely due to which Textile segment reported loss in the E. Y. 2020-21 and half year ended 30th September 2021. With the overall rebound and recovery of the entire economy, we expect that the Textile segment will soon turnaround and will start generating profits in the committy ears.
 - II) The two commercial properties rented out to MNCs continue to yield enough rentals to service the interest on the loans. However, the subsidiaries own land parcels and the expenses/interest on the same has resulted in losses. With the LNG Port facility Skely to commence in Quarter 1 of FY 2022-23, FSRU & LNG Port is expected to yield positive cash flows since inception as the Company has entered loss binding agreements for the same.
