#### Report on the Audit of the Financial Results

## **Opinion**

- 1. We have audited the accompanying quarterly financial results of The Tinplate Company of India Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") for the quarter ended September 30; 2021 and the year to date results for the period from April 1, 2021 to September 30, 2021, attached herewith, the statement of assets and liabilities as on that date and the statement of cash flows for the half-year ended on that date (the "results") which are included in the accompanying 'Statement of Audited Financial Results for the Quarter and Six Months ended 30th September, 2021, Audited Statement of Assets and Liabilities as at 30th September, 2021 and Audited Statement of Cash Flows for the Six Months ended 30th September, 2021' (the "Statement"), being submitted by the company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended (the "Listing Regulations").
- 2. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the results:
  - (i) are presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations in this regard; and
  - (ii) give a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the applicable accounting standards prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the net profit and other comprehensive income and other financial information for the quarter ended September 30, 2021 as well as the year to date results for the period from April 1, 2021 to September 30, 2021, and also the statement of assets and liabilities as at September 30, 2021 and the statement of cash flows for the half-year ended on that date.

In preparing the results, the Board of Directors are responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.
