Report on the Audit of Standalone Annual Financial Results

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying standalone annual financial results of Transformers and Rectifiers (India) Limited (hereinafter referred to as the "Company") for the year ended March 31, 2022, attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended ("Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid standalone annual financial results:

In preparing the Consolidated annual financial results, the respective Board of Directors of the Companies included in the Group are responsible for assessing the ability of the Group to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Group or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.



The respective Board of Directors of the Companies included in the Group is also responsible for overseeing the financial reporting process of the Group.

We remain solely responsible for our audit opinion.

We communicate with those charged with governance of the Holding Company regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

We also performed procedures in accordance with the circular issued by the SEBI under Regulation 33(8) of the Listing Regulations, as amended, to the extent applicable.

4. Other Matters

- (i) The accompanying statement includes the results for the year ended March 31, 2022, being the balancing figures between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published unaudited year to date figures up to the third quarter of the current financial year which were subjected to the limited review by us.
- (ii) The accompanying statement includes the audited financial results and the other financial information, in respect of 4 Subsidiaries, whose financial Statement reflect total assets of Rs.8,135.25 Lakhs as at March 31, 2022, total Revenues of Rs.9,800.91 Lakhs, Net Profit of Rs.298.39 Lakhs and Net Cash Inflow of Rs.90.28 Lakhs for the year ended as on that date, as considered in the Statement which has been audited by their respective Independent Auditors, which are included in the statement as under:
