#### Opinion

We have audited the accompanying statement of standalone financial result of BDH Industries Limited ('the company'), for the year ended March 31,2023 ("the Statement"), being submitted by the Company Pursuant to the requirements of regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations,2015,as amended ('Listing Regulation').

In Our Opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanation given to us, the statement

- a. is presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the listing regulations and
- b. give a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurements principles laid down in the applicable Indian Accounting Standards ("Ind AS") and other accounting principles generally accepted in India of the net profit and total comprehensive income and other financial information for the ended March 31, 2023 and the standalone statement of assets and liabilities and the standalone statement of cash flows as at the year ended on that date..

#### **Basis for Opinion**
